

If I Had a Wish for Water










If I had a wish for water, everyone would use it with care. Water is such a precious gift. We all must learn to share.




If I had a wish for water, Dad wouldn't run the faucet 'til it gushes.



He'd turn all the water off while he gargles, sings, and brushes.



and the sound of wasted water wouldn't cause my brain such pain.




If I had a wish for water, we wouldn't let it cool overflowing in the sink.




Instead we'd chill it in the fridge for when we need a cold drink.




If I had a wish for water, sprinklers wouldn't run when rain begins to fall.




Water would be used more wisely, and the grass would still grow tall.




If I had a wish for water, we wouldn't let it flow into the street.




We'd cut off the hose and spray again when the scrubbing job's complete.
